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Two GP Education Topics for the Price of One at Bethesda Health Care

The second Bethesda Health Care General Practitioner (GP) Education session for 2015 will be on Tuesday 17 March from 6:30pm in the hospital café, and will be offering two topics for the attending GP's. Three doctors who specialise in the area of Cardiology and Infectious Diseases will present on two topics entitled **“Cardiology: Angiograms and Post Coronary Stenting Management”** and **“Antimicrobial Stewardship: What GP's Should Know”**.

Up to 50 GP's are expected to attend the session presented by Assoc Prof David Playford, Cardiologist; Dr Jenny Deague, Cardiologist, and Prof Miles Beaman, Infectious Diseases Physician and Clinical Microbiologist.

Topics covered includes:

- When should we request a CT Coronary Angiogram and what should we do with the results?
- Post-Coronary Stenting management demystified
- Antimicrobial Stewardship programs

This is the first time that Cardiology and Infectious Disease specialty have been included in the popular GP Education program, and also the first time that two topics have been presented at the same session. Now in its third year hosted by the Claremont based hospital, future topics include Orthopaedics, Pain Management, Breast Cancer treatment and Plastic Surgery.
